  - 85% of seniors (29/34) are projected to receive the high school diploma.
  - 15% of seniors (5/34) are expected to receive a certificate of completion due to the following reasons:
    - a. 1 student has not met her math requirement to date
    - b. 1 student has not met her reading or math requirement but may be eligible for a waiver and/or the use of a concordant score once she takes the FAST exam at least once and her EOCs.
    - c. 3 students are below 2.0 and currently completing credit recovery coursework

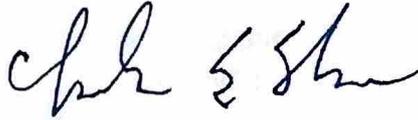
1. Tony Arza gave Government Relations updates.
